### Personal, Social & Emotional Development

The children have really settled well together as a class. They have formed and sustained positive relationships with their adults and peers and are beginning to enjoy sharing experiences with others during group play. We aim for the children to continue to build on these relations and to become confident to talk in front of their peers during play and circle time discussions.

# Communication & Language

The children have become familiar with nursery rhymes and songs. This term, they will learn new vocabulary relating to 'Festivals'. We hope they will come home and share their new language with you. We will also continue to share lots of story books together to enable the children to become more familiar with story language and using repeated phrases. They will be developing their listening skills during these stories and when taking turns in conversations with others.

### **Physical Development**

To support pre-writing skills, the children have been working on fine motor skills. We have been threading beads, manipulating play dough and using scissors to cut materials. We will continue to work on these. We will continue to explore using one-handed tools and equipment as the children construct with a range of materials. This will be linked to our topic, Festivals. Please bring in any recyclable objects for junk modelling, such as egg boxes, cereal boxes, kitchen roll tubes etc.
