This term, we have started looking at Traditional Tales. The children have listened to 'Goldilocks and The Three Bears,' 'The Gingerbread Man' and 'The Three Little Pigs.' They have been joining in with key phrases, beginning role play and started getting creative. We even made some Gingerbread biscuits! We still have many more stories to read and to learn about.

The children appear to be happy and enjoying school life. We are very proud of them!

# Personal, Social & Emotional Development

The children are becoming confident in developing new friendships and getting to know the adults within Team Woodland. We are encouraging the children to communicate with one another, inviting each other into their play and comforting one another if they see a friend upset.

# Communication & Language

As mentioned, the children will become familiar with story language and using repeated phrases. They will demonstrate this through role play, looking at images and playing alongside each other and adults.

### **Physical Development**

To develop writing skills, the children have been working on fine motor activities. We have been threading, manipulating play dough and we will begin to use scissors to cut on lines and patterns.

In PE, the children will be working with the sports coach who visits us on Mondays.

### Literacy

We will be starting our Phonics lessons using 'Letterland' where we will be learning a new sound each day. The children come home with a wordless book each week. Please ensure you 'read' with your child at least four times a week as this encourages storytelling and vocabulary.

#### Maths

We will be concentrating on number value and will be helping the children to become secure in their knowledge of numbers to 5 this term. This includes different ways of representing and making numbers (up to 5), doubling numbers (to 5) and exploring odd and even numbers (up to 5).

## Understanding the World

Using the Traditional Tales as starting points, the children will be learning about kindness and diversity (The Ugly Duckling), working collaboratively (The Enormous Turnip) and different types of homes (The Three Little Pigs).

### Expressive Arts

The children will be learning how to use a range of tools and materials. This term, we will look at attaching materials together using different types of glue and begin to use scissors thinking about the positioning of our thumb.

- ★ Please ensure your child has <u>all</u> school uniform **clearly labelled with their name.** We already have a number of jumpers and cardigans with no names finding their way into lost property.
- ★ The children should be bringing a clearly named school water bottle to school.
- ★ Please ensure the children come into school wearing their **PE kits** on **Mondays**. They do not need to bring in their school uniforms on this day as they will not be getting changed.
