Personal, Social & Emotional Development

Already the children have developed positive relationships with both their peers and adults. We aim for them to continue to build on this and to become increasingly confident in being able to talk, discuss and negotiate in front of their class and adults.

Communication & Language

The children this term will focus on key vocabulary relevant to our new topic 'Festivals' and explore their meanings. They will also continue to develop their understanding of using key phrases and story language.

Physical Development

In order to support the children's fine motor skills, we will continue to engage in activities such as: using scissors to cut out lines and patterns, threading beads and holding a paintbrush.

In PE, the children will continue to work with a coach on a weekly basis.

Literacy

We have sent home picture books for you to look at with your child, encouraging them to explain what is happening in each page. We will continue to use Letterland to learn new sounds and begin to read simple words.

Maths

This half term we will be looking at number recognition. We will using practical activities to develop an understanding patterns, practising simple addition and subtraction, sorting and ordering by size and exploring shapes.

Understanding the World

Our topic 'Festivals' lends itself beautifully to this area of learning. The children will make comparisons and looks at similarities and differences between what they celebrate and what other people celebrate.

Expressive Arts

The children will continue to create structures using a variety of materials; looking at textures and building models using junk materials. They will also participate in some cookery.
