Hello and welcome back! Hopefully, you have all had thoroughly deserved restful half term and now ready to enjoy our second term and the run up to Christmas! We certainly are! The children have settled brilliantly into their school routine and it has been lovely seeing such happy smiley faces coming into school in the mornings. Thank you to all those parents/carers who took part in our Parent Teacher Consultations. It was great to have the chance to discuss your child's targets with you and get to know your thoughts too.

English

- * Writing The children will be looking at two genres in particular, Instructional Texts and Non-Chronological Reports. To help with the writing of an instructional text, the children will learn the process of mummification. We cannot wait to teach this lesson. For Non-chronological reports the children will use their knowledge and understanding of Egypt to write up formal, factual information using technical language and presentation techniques such as subheadings and bullet points.
- ★ In SPaG, Year 3s will start to gain a better understanding of how to use paragraphs consistently in their writing for clarity and cohesion. They will learn how to use 2nd Person pronouns for instructional texts which are you, your and yours. The children will also be looking at time conjunctions such as next, then, after, finally and start to think about adverbials to express time such as a minute later, during the next 10 minutes.
- ★ Reading Our guided reading groups are well established and the children are having frequent practice at reading supported by both oral and written comprehension tasks.
- ★ Spellings Your child will continue working through their 'Spelling Wall'.
- ★ Handwriting Your child will be able to practise their cursive Hilltop script handwriting using words from their spelling wall to write in sentences.

Maths


★ Number- We are currently looking at Addition and Subtraction.

The Year 3s will be working on adding and subtracting 2 and 3 digit numbers crossing over into the next 10 or 100. They will also be looking at adding and subtracting multiples of 100 from any given number

Mr Rose earns £ 124 on Monday.

He earns £ 138 on Tuesday.

How much does he earn in total? £ 262



- ★ Multiplication and Division Our next focus during this part of the term will be Multiplication and Division. This will include looking at multiplying and dividing using the 3, 4 and 8 times tables. They will use this to make comparative statements.
- ★ Times Table knowledge- The Year 3s are well established in their routine of weekly times tables practice. Please continue to work on this skill at home as it is so valuable to support in many other areas of their maths learning. Using TT Rockstars will help with this. We have set programs on there so that the children are focusing on the same set of times tables they are practicing in school.

Foundation Subjects

The children have loved learning about the Ancient Egyptians. We will be continuing this topic this term. Amongst other things, they will be learning about the mummification process and get to try this out for themselves first hand (on a plastic cup, before you ask!)

- ★ In **Art** this term the children will look at enhancing their clay modelling skills. They will sketch, design, make and then paint their own Egyptian masks.
- ★ In History and Geography, children will continue to research both historical and geographical features of the Ancient Egyptian civilisation. What they learn during their topic sessions will be linking directly to their writing in the early part of the term. They will practically practice mummifying a 'body' using materials such as plastic cups and cocktail sticks to remove organs.
- ★ In Science, we are going to look at Living Things and Their Habitats learning about food chains, carnivores, herbivores and Omnivores as well as Vertebrates and invertebrates.
- ★ In PSHE the children will continue to learn mindful ways of thinking, listening and seeing as well as thinking about memories

My Writing Checklist

- CL and FS! ? "", '
- 2. Commas in a list
- 3. 'a' and 'an' used correctly
- 4. Conjunctions using: while, before, after, because, although, if
- 5. Range of adverbs, e.g. then, soon, next, therefore
- 6. Prepositions, e.g. before, after, during, in
- 7. Verbs, e.g. has gone/have been
- 8. Paragraphs (change of time, place, person)
- 9. Joined handwriting and correct spellings

My Maths Checklist (Y3)

- 1. 2D shapes and their properties, including all 6 quadrilaterals.
- 2. Number Bonds to 10/20/50/100
- 3. Rapid recall of adding any single digits (leading to 2-digit)
- 4. Unit fractions of amounts e.g. $\frac{1}{4}$ of 32
- 5. Times Tables including 7, 8 and 9s
- 6. Conversions of Metric units such as 100cm = 1m and 1000q = 1kq
- 7. Time facts such as 'past' the hour and 'to' the hour, quarter past = 15 mins past
