English

- ★ Writing the children will start reading 'Rough Ride to Runneymede' by Cat Glass, which is linked to our topic this term: 'Love the local life you live'. They will be focussing on creative writing in the context of diaries and newspaper reports in order to practise the grammar skills covered in the last two terms.
- ★ Reading- In order to keep up the amazing success with reading badges, or help your child work towards one, please ensure you are hearing your child read at least four times a week and signing the calendar in their reading diaries. Even confident readers should continue to read aloud to an adult.
- ★ Spellings your child will continue to work through their spelling wall with additional topical vocabulary.

Maths

★ Fractions and units of measure; geometry.

The children will be investigating measurement of distance, and mass. They will be looking at fractions of measure and practising column addition and subtraction in this context.

We will then look at geometry and build on their knowledge of properties of shape including classifying angles.

Towards the end of the half term we will revisit money with calculations involving + - x ÷

★ 1- minute maths

We will be continuing the daily practice of times tables and number bonds to help boast the children's fluency. We are encouraging the children to record the time they have taken to answer the questions as well as their score to give them a measure of their success. Please use TTR at home as often as possible.
