PE days this half term Monday and Tuesday – Bracken and Sundew Tuesday and Thursday – Heather


## **English**

- ★ Writing the children will spend this half term focussing on writing creative, well structures sentences based on our class read *The Boy with the Bronze Axe*. They will complete various creative writing tasks inspired by this book, starting with using adjectives and adverbs to describe a setting.
- ★ Reading- our home reading aim is for children to be heard reading at least four times a week, if they do this across ten weeks they will earn their bronze reading badge. Our class reading text will continue to be *The Boy with the Bronze Axe* by Kathleen Fidler.
- ★ Spellings please continue to support your child with their five weekly spellings in their blue spelling books.

## **Maths**

### **Addition and subtraction**

We will be revisiting our addition and subtraction number facts, building up to solving addition and subtraction problems with up to three digit numbers.



We will introduce column methods and teach strategies for exchanging as shown in the image.

By this stage pupils need to be able add and subtract single digits mentally without counting on. Frequent practise on Numbots will help to consolidate this knowledge and greatly reduce the stress of calculating more complex addition and subtraction equations.

### Home learning expectation

Children should continue to practise playing on TTRockstars at least once a week and NumBots at least once a week – this is replacing *MyMaths* as their set homework.
